Lisa was just a girl when she lost her mother to breast cancer. It all happened so fast. Her mother's diagnosis came in October, and she passed away in January of the following year. **Lisa's mother was only 53 years old.**

In 2015, Lisa founded a walk to raise money for the Belleville General Hospital Foundation (BGHF). **Her goal was to walk 53 kilometres — one kilometre for every year her beautiful mother was alive.**

In the early days, there were only six walkers, including Lisa and her two sisters. But over the years, the walk has grown. The largest event saw 40 participants walk to raise money for cancer care.

Lisa's mission is to keep cancer care close to home. She wishes that was an option when her mother was in treatment. "That way, we could've spent more time with her," said Lisa.

When patients don't have to travel far for treatment or appointments, they can spend more of their precious time at home, with their families.

Year after year, Lisa walks, even when her feet are full of blisters. She does it for her mother. For every patient who lost their life to breast cancer. She does it for the young moms currently fighting the disease. Lisa walks for all the cancer patients yet to come, and for their families.
